On Saturday, scheduled events include: a complimentary continental breakfast in Cheadle Plaza at 9 a.m. hosted by Chancellor Henry T. Yang; special faculty presentations that range in topic from bacterial diseases to television violence from 10 a.m. to noon in Buchanan Hall rooms; and dinner and swing dancing at the Faculty Club beginning at 6:30 p.m. Faculty Club event is \$6 per person.
